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EJERCICIO DE SEGUNDA LENGUA EXTRANJERA, INGLÉS
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Jules Verne and Nautilus

Jules Verne was born in Nantes. He studied law in Paris. Some years later, his uncle introduced him into literary circles and he started to publish novels. Verne married Honorine de Viane, a young widow, and lived with his family in a large provincial house.

Verne survived a murder attempt in 1886. His crazy nephew, Gaston, shot him in the leg and the author was disabled for the rest of his life.

Verne's novels gained soon a big popularity throughout the world. Without the education of a scientist or experiences as a traveller, Verne spent much of his time in research for his books.

In *Twenty Thousand Leagues under the Sea*, Verne introduced one of the first modern superheroes, Captain Nemo, famous for his extraordinary submarine, *Nautilus*.

Verne combined science and invention with adventure. But the most important thing is that some of Verne's fiction has also become a fact; for example, his submarine Nautilus anticipated the first power submarine.

As you read this exciting book, published in 1870, consider the time in which the adventure happens, around the year 1866. At that time, people used trains, horses, sailing ships to travel. Edison did not invent the light bulb until 10 years later. Sailors used the winds and stars to navigate from one place to another.

So, the most amazing thing about this wonderful book is that it was written in that same time period. Think about the extraordinary vision of the writer, who lived in such world, and yet was able to imagine a submarine.
